Disposal of Biohazardous Biologic Materials

- 1. Deposit in biohazard bags and solid containers as appropriate:
 - a. tissue parts, blood vials, transfusion bags
 - b. catheters, IV sets
 - any items involved with a suspected or proven Class I or Class II disease (Zoonotic);
 examples include bandages, cotton balls, wraps and other supplies used with animals in isolation
 - d. biologics (vaccines)
 - e. concentrated insecticides unless label directions indicate other methods of disposal
 - f. cancer chemotherapeutic agents and the supplies used to measure and administer them
 - g. Hypodermic needles and syringes must be disposed of properly. Needles are not to be recapped. Place the syringe with needle attached in a plastic "Sharps" container. (Note that no sample is to be submitted to the clinical laboratories in a syringe with needle.)
- 2. All other disposable items may be put into the regular trash containers.
